DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

County Facilities Director Corey Johnson said the roof project at the Administration Building is wrapping up today and a walk through is scheduled for tomorrow. He said he and County Auditor Eric Van Lancker are walking through the building with a vendor to have directional signs placed in the building. He said storage space is being switched in the Satellite Office in DeWitt to give the Sheriff’s Office more office space. Johnson added he’s still waiting for a firm date on when the parking lot project will begin at the Administration Building.

County Sheriff Bill Greenwalt said a smaller bike ride went through the County this weekend. He said there were about 500 bicyclists that went through with no incidents. He said a recent traffic safety project was successful.

Supervisor Irwin attended a workforce development training in Ankeny. He said they talked about how ARP funds could be used. He said the workforce development area that covers the County receives 35% of the state funding.

County Treasurer Dustin Johnson reported the tax sale is next week and 754 bidders have registered. There is \$1.303 million in delinquent property tax included in the tax sale.

DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION

Secondary Roads dump truck purchase: County Engineer Todd Kinney said it will be 12-14 months before equipment can be delivered. He said if the Board allows him to proceed with the purchase that he is making them aware the truck will be paid for in the FY23 budget year.

MOTION by Supervisor Srp to authorize the County Engineer to proceed with purchasing a dump truck to be paid during the 2023 fiscal year for the Secondary Road Department.

Roll Call: Srp: Yes; Irwin: Yes; Determann: Yes. Motion carried.

Clinton Substance Abuse Council (CASAC) Grant Payment: Van Lancker reported that CSAC was not able to receive their JAG grants funds for work it did in the community during fiscal year 20 due to a series of mistakes. Van Lancker said the amount is about \$3,000 and he could identify that amount in this year’s budget if the Board approved the payment or a portion of the payment.

MOTION by Supervisor Srp to authorize Van Lancker to make a claim for CSAC in the amount contracted for services provided in FY20.

Roll Call: Srp: Yes; Irwin: Yes; Determann: Yes. Motion carried.

Outside Agency Funding: Van Lancker said a recent list of questions and answers was provided by the State of Iowa Auditor’s Office in regards to counties making contributions to private non-profit organizations. He said he has asked the State Auditor’s Office for a clarification and has also shared this information with the County Attorney. He said without the clarification, it appears that the Board will not be able to provide the traditional second-half allocations to the private non-profit organizations that do not qualify. Van Lancker said if the County is not able to make those second-half payments then a letter should go to those non-profits. It was agreed to review this matter again next week in hopes there may be more direction from the County Attorney or State Auditor’s Office.

County Employee Compensation and Benefits for FY22: Srp said it was decided last week to hold the health benefits contribution at 8% instead of the originally set 11% contribution. Irwin said the Sheriff’s Office employees were awarded a 3% wage increase through arbitration. He said because of that he believes all staff in the County should receive the 3% wage increase. Irwin said the County has taken on a lot more tax responsibility through the purchase of communication radios and solid waste agency contributions, while the other cities are awarding higher wages. County Budget Director Nicholas Manrique said the 1 % increase will cost the budget \$100,000-\$125,000. Van Lancker explained those funds will need to come out of reserves. Determann said it was a tough year for everyone and County employees worked hard to keep the County running with few issues. Srp said he doesn’t disagree, but is not a fan of this happening outside of budget planning. But Srp said he recognizes this is a different set of circumstances.

MOTION by Supervisor Irwin to set County employee wage increases to 3% for those who had it originally set at 2% for fiscal year 2022.

Roll Call: Srp: Yes; Irwin: Yes; Determann: Yes.

Motion carried.

County Wage Study: Irwin said this has been brought up in the past, but after the arbitrator decision from the Sheriff’s Office Union negotiations, he said it appears that a wage study could have helped the County. He said he was not quantifying wages for certain individuals. He would like an outside agency to do a wage study and compare with other counties. Irwin said he is concerned if they learn they have to increase wages for some positions. Srp said the wage study should be careful with private industry comparisons, which he said was ignored in the arbitrator’s decision. He said this study also needs to include benefits packages. Srp said he’s nervous about the study because of the ability to pay in a County like Clinton County where the tax-base growth has been small. He said that will need to be considered. Srp said HR should provide more information about a study and the cost for a study before committing to a study.

County Job Efficiency Committee: Irwin said he isn’t looking at cutting any employees, however when someone leaves it should be considered if those duties could be shared among other employees. Srp said cross training clerks has been brought up previously, but never gained ground. He said that thought has never had buy-in previously, but he said that may be closer to reality now. County Recorder Scott Judd said he had a clerk from the Auditor’s Office help about three or four years ago during a busy boat renewal season and it didn’t work as well as he had hoped. He said an employee doing a job once a week for a couple of weeks lacked proficiency needed for the program to be successful. Srp said HR might be able to shed some light on how this may work.
