The Board of Supervisors of Clinton County, Iowa, met. Present were Supervisors Determann, Irwin and Srp. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

A moment of silence was observed in the memory of Clinton County Veterans Affairs Director Ed Staszewski.

Coronavirus/COVID-19 update: Community Health Manager Michele Cullen reported there were 120 new cases since last week in the County. She said that increase has been consistent to what the county has seen. She hopes that means the County is hitting a peak and a plateau. Cullen said there have been a lot more younger people who have made up the new cases. She said hospitalizations in the region are down to 122; with Mercy at six and Genesis with 23. Cullen said 77% of those in the hospital around the state are not vaccinated and 88% of those in the ICU are not vaccinated. She said the County is 48.5% vaccinated which is a small increase from last week. Cullen reported the FDA met last week to consider approval of booster dose, but it was not approved. She said there is more to come on that.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

RESOLUTION 2021-249 discussion: The resolution was tabled last week and returned this week for consideration. Supervisor Irwin asked for clarification of the study. County Attorney Mike Wolf said this would not include a wage study that is currently being conducted by the HR office. Wolf said this firm has done these types of studies in the past. He said this study could assist the office and the County from facing liability by making sure they have the correct amount of time to spend with cases in his office. He said the Scott County Attorney's Office conducted a similar study and found it to be beneficial. Irwin is concerned if the study comes back and suggests that the office is short-staffed. Chairman Determann said it will just be a study for consideration. Supervisor Srp did clarify that the study is being paid for out of the County Attorney recovery fund. County HR Director Dawn Aldridge said the study in Scott County also provided them with ways to be more efficient. She said the study recommended hiring five new staff, but they only hired two new staff.

The following resolution was presented and on motion approved:

WHEREAS, the Clinton County Attorney's Office has discretionary funds available in the County Attorney Recovery Fund (0029) to provide for such an evaluation; and

WHEREAS, the Clinton County Attorney's Office seeks to enter into an Agreement with the Skywalk agency to perform such study not to exceed \$10,000; now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Clinton County Attorney is authorized to enter into an office workload evaluation study agreement with the Office's Recovery Funds.

DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

County Auditor Eric Van Lancker said his office has received nomination papers from the cities and schools in Clinton County. He said voters can now submit a request to have an absentee ballot mailed to them. He said absentee ballots will be mailed out and in-person absentee voting will both begin on October 13. He said the part-time VA officials are covering the VA office the best they can for now. Van Lancker reminded the Board that the broadband study public meeting is at 6 p.m. on Wednesday at the Clinton County Fairgrounds.

Wolf said the Mental Health region sent out a contract for review. He said DHS is basically requiring a certain performance of the region and said the diminishment of the county involvement is remarkable to him. Wolf said he's concerned there is no appeal for a region if the DHS determines the region is not meeting thresholds. He said a due process provision should be included in the contract and if this was a contract directly with the County, he wouldn't recommend signing it.

Aldridge said she attended a conference last week where attorneys talked about the vaccination mandates ordered by the U.S. President. She said there should be more specific rules in a couple of weeks.

County Facilities Coordinator Corey Johnson reported the parking lot project at the Administration Building is moving ahead pretty well. He said there will be a change order to reconstruct a manhole on the south side of the building. He is meeting tomorrow about the air handlers for the Administration Building. He said a fire panel in the Courthouse has been acting up and replacement parts are hard to find because the panel is so old. He said the panel is still working, but it is calling the service several times a day. He said the panel will have to be changed out if a control board can't be found. He said the full replacement could be up to \$60,000.

DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION

Update of Solar Projects in the County: Wolf said he and County Planning and Zoning Director Thomas Barnes are looking further into the ordinances for solar projects. They are wondering if they should get outside assistance from someone who may specialize in this subject matter. Srp believes there may be enough resources that outside counsel may not be needed. Srp said they should have a good amount of information to make decisions next week as to not hold up the process too much longer. Determann said he would like Wolf to look into how much it would cost to engage a specialist in this topic. Wolf said he would look into it. Srp and Irwin both said they are struggling with what the Board's role is in the process as they believe property owners should be able to decide what to do with their property. Wolf is concerned there may be something they didn't think about because they are not experts in this field. Another update on a proposed zoning ordinance will be scheduled for next week's meeting.
