DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

Clinton County Auditor Eric Van Lancker reminded the Board its October 7 meeting will be in the large conference room of the County Satellite Office in DeWitt as the Law Center is hosting a regional training that day.

Supervisor Srp said the Clinton County Justice Coordinating Commission will meet this week to consider the future of the commission. He said they have not met in more than a year.

Chairman Irwin said he attended a meeting in Hiawatha last week that included good discussion about how the new Mental Health Region could operate.

Supervisor George said the FEMA radiological recovery/reentry exercise with Scott County went well last week.

County Treasurer Dustin Johnson said today is the last day of tax collection and there is still \$15 million first-half payments due yet to be collected so it will be a busy week. He said auto electronic registrations and titling is starting to ramp up. He said this should be a good thing for Clinton County's revenue stream.

County EMA Director Chance Kness reported the FEMA exercise last week went well and was a good test of GIS mapping and public information officer capabilities.

County HR Director Alexandria Ellisson said her office participated in the Clinton High School Career Night and it was well attended, and they spoke with a several students. She said HR office is currently under construction so she can be reached by phone and her assistant is moving to the other side of the office. She said the employee handbook will be reviewed at the department head meeting this week. She said the Board needs to work on scheduling for the Sheriff's Office union negotiations.

DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION

Request for County Opioid Funds for a Recovery Housing Project: Dominic Copella, Rediscover Recovery Community Center, said he had planned to ask today the Board for matching funds for a state grant for recovery housing, however he said that plan has been delayed. He said he sees people every day who are released from jail or

from recovery who enter homelessness. He said there is still a need for a recovery housing program, but it will have to wait. Irwin said he appreciates what Copella has done to this point and said there are others out there who are willing to help and said he needs to lean on his board. Srp said Copella shouldn't let this bring him down because he's done so much already and it's important for him to stabilize what he has started. George said she met with Copella last week and expressed it may be too much too soon, but she said he should not feel defeated because there will be another opportunity, and this provided time to continue to succeed at what he is doing.

County Sheriff's Office Union Initial Proposal Presentation: Deputy Zach Lange union vice president of the County Sheriff's Office Union presented the Board with its initial proposal to begin negotiations. The two-year proposal included 12% wage increases each year for deputies and correctional officers, three years between steps; a new secretary starting base wage; include secretaries on longevity, sick leave paid on retirement and other demands.

MOTION by Srp to receive and place on file the union's initial proposal.

Mississippi Valley Workforce Development Board Administrative Team Update: Miranda Swafford, Executive Director of the board along with other staff members Mandy Tripp, compliance officer, and Tyler Lanz, strategic partnership specialist, presented on how the workforce board and employees operate and programs it offers.

County Engineer's Job Description: County Engineer Todd Kinney said all department heads are in the process of updating job descriptions and his was assigned to Supervisor George. Kinney said he was working with her and found two things in the description that were not included, and they include drainage district responsibilities and roadside management/weed commissioner. Kinney said he doesn't think the drainage district work should not influence the pay of the position because it is only done when there is work to be done. He added the work done for drainage districts is also reimbursed from the district. He said the roadside management he estimated takes about 5% of his time. He said if the engineer position is to be the weed commissioner, then the certification for spraying should be a requirement. Srp said the description should accurately reflect how the County is doing business.

County Treasurer's Office Clerk Job Posting: Johnson said he wanted to meet with the board to get their thoughts of the direction of the office. He said he has two part-time positions which have not been filled for the past year. He said changes in the DOT were also happening a year ago. He said it is becoming clearer it would be helpful to have another full-time clerk added to the staff especially when staff is out on vacation, lunch times and illnesses. He doesn't believe running the staff in the redline full-time is the best way to run the office. He believes the DOT cross-county registrations will also increase work for his office. Johnson said he is also concerned with quality of candidate when hiring part-time versus a full-time position. He said if this were added in the next three months there would be room in the current budget because the part-time position was not back filled for a while. County Budget Director Nick Manrique said there may need to be a budget amendment on some of the benefits line. Srp said he would like to have a follow up conversation with Johnson before acting on it today. Johnson said technology currently allows them to tread water right now, but he expects work to increase because of the new technology. Johnson said increasing by 15% the use of the treasurer's website for property tax payments would be significant to workflow efficiency. Ellison said the treasurer's department is showing the most burn out of all the county departments, but they did have some illnesses earlier in the year. Srp said he understands the work is there right now and it can be reevaluated later through attrition. But he said he would like to review the staff levels of the Treasurer's Office during the last few years. The Board generally agreed to review the request next week.

Appoint a representative to the Ports of Eastern Iowa Board: Irwin said the port authority committee is ready to move forward now that all the counties have agreed to work together. He said a member of the Board of Supervisors needs to be appointed to start the development of the by-laws and 28J agreement. He said it isn't time yet to appoint citizens to a board that doesn't yet exist. He said there will be a meeting next Wednesday at the Western Illinois Moline campus. He said the next day will be an all-day training on the operations of a port authority. Irwin said the City of Clinton has been considering becoming a port and he said that can also happen within the Ports of Eastern Iowa Port Authority. Dennis Lauver, Clinton, said there should be more than one person per county on the port authority board. He said some port authorities also include working committees which is another good reason to have more than one representative from each county. George said municipality participation should also be considered.

County Administration Building Project Update: Van Lancker and Irwin reported the front entry work will continue through completion and the Auditor's Office door will be used during voting time. Irwin said they came out of the Friday meeting and by Tuesday a bunch of new plans started to unfold. Van Lancker thanked the departments for being flexible to last-minute adjustments. Johnson said the painting for his office is moving forward and if it is done this week then the countertop can be installed.
